Hawskridge 2nd Oct 1842

My dear Sir

You have of course heard of the misfortune that has happened to your old residence Hamburg - As I understand you to say that you did not take on the courses - I have sent mine - which contains some account of it - Fire & flood are two dreadful agents - but I hope the latter will not be so hurtful to me an individual, as the former has been to Hamburg as a community - but great commiseration and assistance have been given to her by all the neighbouring states - The Governor refused me in my distress, and in a very rude manner the trifling assistance of six men for ten days, for which may God reward him as he may merit -

I dare say he refrains to think what he can revenge himself on me for acting according to my conscience and my duty as a colonist - but I hope to get well out of the affair in spite of his malice -

We have completed the banks to nearly their original height but it will take ten days more to make them firm - The corn is all uncovered and dry, but looks very puny and sickly
