

John Terry -

married Martha Powell (Welsh). About the year 1818 he sold his Cotton Mill - Redmere Yorkshire and his Flour mill Askrigg Yorkshire and with his wife and family 3 sons & 8 daughters came to Sydney. His belongings included, two years provisions, servants and mill stones. He got a grant of land on the Paramatta River and also owned some land in what is now the Centre of Sydney, but regarding this as of little value allowed his title to lapse. At Sydney a Terry who had been sent out as a convict claimed relationship so in order to get away from such a connection he transferred to Tasmania. The undesirable Terry became very wealthy and his descendants are or lately were rich residents of Sydney.

John Terry got a grant of 1200 acres at Macquarie Plains Tasmania and another of 100 acres for a mill at New Norfolk Tasmania both from Governor Mr Arthur. He built a house and flour mill at New Norfolk with water wheels driven by water from the Lachlan River discharging into the Derwent River on the banks of which his mill was located. When John Terry married Martha Powell he lived at Beecroft Hall, Lord Cocton's estate where he was employed as a Factor. Martha Powell was a relation of Lord Cocton's and when she left England received her portion out of the estate. Her father Thomas Powell was a political fugitive from Wales he lived at Housby Castle married Margaret Theaton & had 10 children.

John Terry died in 1857.
