BARNARD FAMILY PAPERS 1813 - 1901

James Barnard (1809 - 1897) was the son of John George Barnard of Blackfriars, London, a printer and, a freeman of the City of London Company of Stationers. James was apprenticed to his father to learn the printing trade in 1825. In 1838 he was appointed Government Printer, VDL. and arrived in Hobart with his wife and sister on the <u>Pyramus</u> in March 1839. He lived and worked in Macquarie Street (Surrey House). As well as a daughter, Emily, in the had three sons, James, Henry Sultzer and Charles D. born in Tasmania.
